FAQ 1

Can I visit the center with my friends?
Can I discuss something I witnessed?



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Victims and others who have witnessed or heard about the incident can report to the school authority.

The school authority may check in with the victim if they want to proceed with the school process.

If the victim do not want to, the incident will not be investigated. Thus, please talk to the victim in advance to see if s/he wants the school to know about the incident.

FAQ 2

I want to report the perpetrator, but I am concerned that others may know what have happened and I may face disadvantages.



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We prioritize the confidentiality of the reported cases and the identity of the involved people.

Any information or details shall not be released to a third person without the consent of the victim or the accused.

We take this issue very seriously and do our utmost effort to protect the alleged victims from any potential discrimination and unfair treatment.

FAQ 3

What comes next after reporting an incident?



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The alleged victim's opinion is valued the most in dealing with the reported incident.

There are several options available for the alleged victims: school's official engagement, reporting to the police, and settlement with the accused.

FAQ 4

I don't want to make it official, but I do need someone to talk and take the weight off my shoulders. Can I have counseling only?

Of course, you can have counseling only. We truly understand that reporting someone or an incident may feel uncomfortable.

You should take care of yourself and your mental health first, and then you can decide whether you want to report the incident.

FAQ 5

How does the reporting process work?
If I report to the school, does the police also get the report? Or do I need to file the reports separately?



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You will still need to report to the police if you pursue a legal action. We can offer resources that you need to report to the police.

If you are still hesitant to go to the police station, you can visit a one-stop center (Sunflower Center) to get counseling on your case and medical treatment, if needed, along with the official report to the police.

FAQ 6

I think what happened was sexual harassment, but I find others think it is nothing serious. Can I report this even if I am the only one who finds it inappropriate?



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Yes you can report it, if you feel you have been sexually harassed or violated. However, it is also important to acknowledge a reasonable third person's view on a given situation.

An incident that seems to be a sexual harassment may not be seen and interpreted the same way to others, and vice versa. We can help you to deal with this discrepancy and find a way to resolve the issue.
